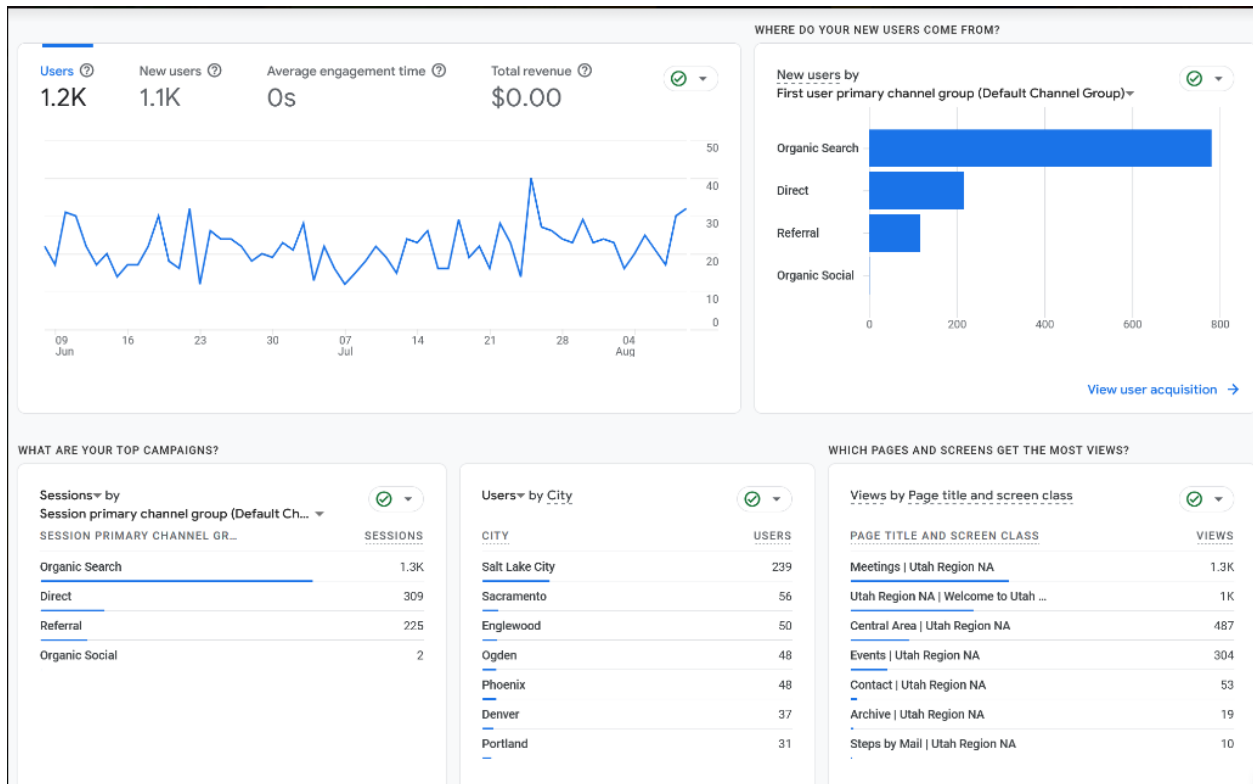

AD-HOC Committee- Women’s Retreat: Mande -

The Women’s Retreat was a successful event in so many ways! We celebrated recovery together, listened to speakers, ate food and spent time in nature. We had 76 total registrations for the weekend. We actually ran out of space for women to park on Friday night because of the amazing turnout! The support that the women showed for one another was incredible! The event was able to come out on top after expenditures and with the collection of registration fees, merchandise sales, 7th tradition, and raffle tickets sales, the total contribution of this event was \$2,296.45. The current bank balance is \$3,814.94 in checking and \$600.14 in savings with a total of \$4, 415.08. The committee voted on increasing our prudent reserve to \$3000, which left us with \$1415.08. We needed to purchase some storage bins after collections leaving us with \$1365 to donate. Guidelines suggest that the remaining

goes straight to Region, but we would also like to see that a percentage goes directly to World services. We have an audit scheduled for Sunday August 18th with me, Jess R, Collyn B, and Kevin. Once the audit is complete, we will move forward with the transfer of additional funds collected. Thank you for allowing me to be of service.

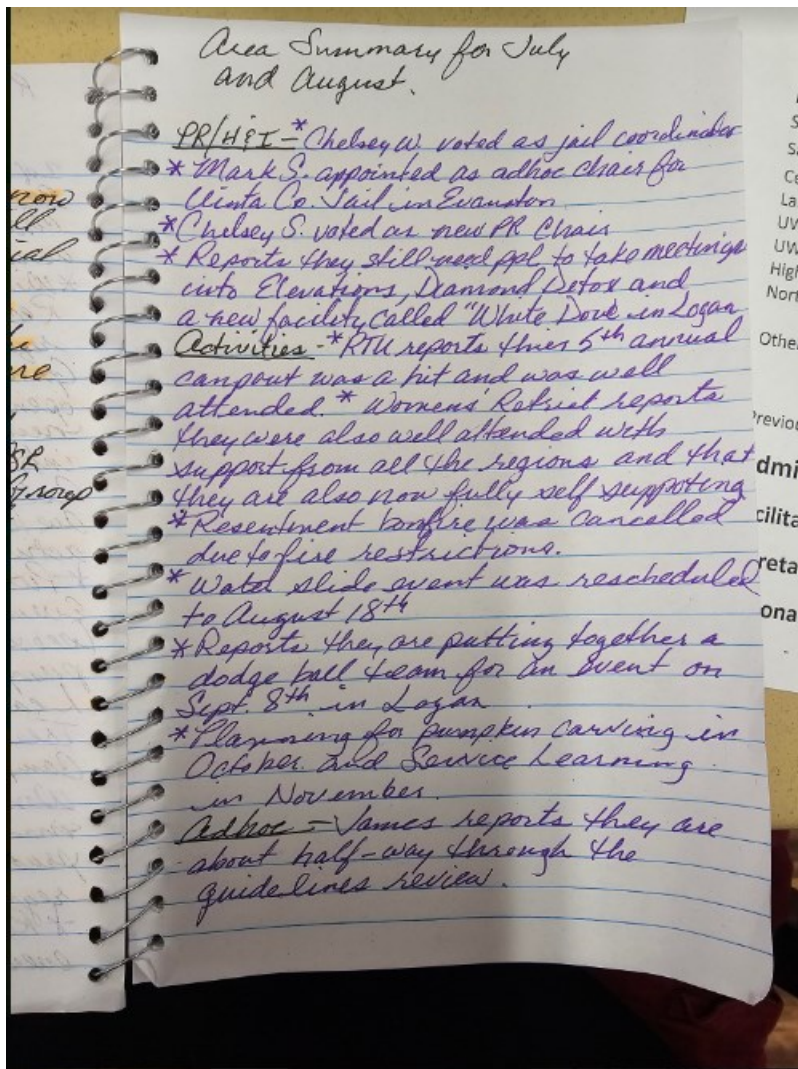

Motion from Women's Retreat - Motion for the Utah NA Women's Retreat committee to become a subcommittee of the Utah Regional Service Committee. Motioned by Mande, 2nd by Eric S – will go back to the homegroups to determine since it will be a change to the guidelines.

This would create a diverse opportunity to spread the message of recovery to women by offering a safe space to celebrate, grow and fellowship within the NA community. It is apparent that there is a need for this type of event in our area and we would like regions support in making this dream a reality. Region's service committee can offer the UNAWR committee with educational support and create connections to other areas in the region that a group or area structure might not. Region can also offer transparency throughout the groups and areas of the gender specific event as the RCM can report back to the areas and the areas report back to the groups. Rather than viewing special interest groups within NA as causing a disruption, we like to simply view it as additional support towards an individual's recovery.

Bulletin #18

Special Interest meetings have existed in Narcotics Anonymous for some time. There does not appear to be anything in the Twelve Traditions which cautions groups against holding special interest meetings, provided that the group has no requirement for membership other than the desire to stop using. Special interest meetings tend to survive and flourish in local NA communities where there is a need and desire for such meetings and do not exist in NA communities where there is no need nor desire.

In Narcotics Anonymous, the World Service Conference does not have the authority to dictate policy to groups, and regional and area service committees do not have policy-making authority over the decisions of their groups. The only authority present in the groups is a loving God expressed in a group's conscience

Some discussion regarding a male coming – the group voted to have it based for women or those that identify as a women, however, we won't make them leave or push them out. Trevor asked what the vibe was and if anyone had stayed. The committee listened to his concerns and feedback. There was no feedback from anyone at the committee that there was any discomfort from any of the women. The committee will be working on the guidelines and will specifically state in the guidelines how these things will be addressed.

Region Reports

CRSCNA Report

Events:

- CRRMCO (annual campout) was this past June, and it went great. There was a bit of a glitch in the online registration, but it was a great success.

- WRCNA is this coming August 23-25 in Empire, CO. WRCNA XI – Women's Retreat of Colorado Narcotics Anonymous – WRCNA (nacolorado.org). This event has grown consistently throughout the years. Even though it's a week before WCNA, it has a lot of registrations.

- CRCNA is this November 15-17 in Denver, CO Home - CRCNA XXXVIII (nacolorado.org). Early Bird registration goes through July 31st with discounted full packets. Preregistration is through October 31st. Lots of great merchandise and a full program with cool entertainment.

Areas:

- SUANA on the western slope is in need of an Area Learning Day and would like some help problem solving a few issues. Several Regional committee members have met to help out but possibly someone from our Zone can shed some insight. If a few folks would like to, we'll contact SUANA to see about setting up a virtual learning day.

- Mountains West Area came to Region announcing there are Groups seeking to restart this Area. They will be attending the Assembly this September to move forward with this process.

- BFF Area has a couple of meetings a week. The regional PR chair will be attending a mtg in their Area to see if they would like anything from the region at this time.

Regional Subcommittees:

- H&I is getting ready to order more literature for DOC. Literature will be going to Florence Federal Correctional Facility. Gilpin County Jail reached out to a member and asked about literature for that facility. Meetings in Colorado DOC facilities are going well. Sponsorship behind the walls flyers are in the facilities. DOC Facilities currently holding H&I meetings are La Vista, Denver Women's, Fremont Correctional, Four Mile Correctional, Skyline Correctional, Arrowhead Correctional, and Territorial Correctional.

- Website pages updated – WSLD, Regional Minutes, PR, CNAC with Waiver form, campout. I think we should add tabs for PR, PI and H&I in addition to CNAC and local areas. H&I audio recording page is back up.

CNAC BOD:

- The Board continues to review and sign contracts for Groups, Areas, and Regional events along with waivers. This process is getting more seamless as we continue to move forward. Both documents are on the website under CNAC.

- Seeking information from other regions if they have Areas and events DBA under their 501c3 status. If so, possibly giving suggestions to the CNAC BOD about best practices.
- Federal taxes are filed and up to date. We continue working on State taxes.

Everything seems to be extremely important, and we feel a deep obligation to carry the information but sometimes it gets lost in translation.

Good day fellow zonies, zanies and zoomies!

It's a good day to be clean. I am here after a whirlwind family vacations tour of 9 days in San Diego, 5 days in Park City and getting to top it off with 4 days here in Helena. Thank you for your warm welcome at the Never Alone Club. I should have known the entrance was around the back, it always is. I love getting to our meetings when I travel, my wife almost as much, after occasional prodding. California meetings always have a lot of handclapping, except at the Pacific Beach meeting that is above a nursery school. They snap there. We attended a meeting in the Sasquatch area of Utah. It is a Mecca for treatment centers, still. Twenty women in a van rolled up, some with hours clean to an addict picking up a 34-year token.

Although the places are different, our message is the same: *An addict, any addict can stop using, lose the desire to use, and find a new way to live.* I love this program and the people in it.

I am here representing the Southern Idaho Region. But it encompasses the western Wyoming ski town of Alta's four meetings per week to Ontario of Eastern Oregon's 6 meetings per week. Ontario is where Southwest Idaho goes for their cannabis, so plenty for us to do there.

My regional secretary tells me:

116 meetings per week. Our region is strong with 5 areas all represented quarterly. We have 3? Regional activities. SIRCNA, Serenity in the Wilderness, PR learning days. Oh, and we observe World Unity Day. We have a men's and women's retreat yearly. Each area has at least one activity per month. Boredom is optional! Our 1st quarter NAWS donation was \$1852.00. 2nd quarter's NAWS donation was \$7371.42. Go team!! We have stepped into

the 21st century and our areas have begun to implement QR codes on schedules (once scanned the QR code takes the addict to a local online meeting schedule) and are discussing other possible uses. Any input would be helpful.

As far as WSC goes, there isn't a lot of interest from most of my regional members. At our last regional convention, I had an hour workshop on the subject and the only people that came were former RD/RDAs. They assured me that this is not a new thing. I suppose I had much less interest back when I was new in recovery. Although attending the WCNA has always been a goal I finally achieved in Orlando. Looking forward to WCNA in D.C.
